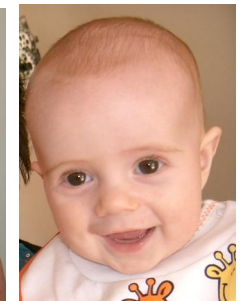
The biggest event of the year, though, was in our family! We are now grandparents!
